





DENTAL JEWELRY

Dental Bleaching (Tooth Whitening) is a common procedure in Cosmetic Dentistry.



Latest technique of bleaching is... Laser Bleaching

which uses light energy to accelerate the process of Bleaching

Tooth whitening can be done in approximately 1 hour, in a single visit to the Dentist. (depending on the condition of a person's teeth).

SCALING

Scaling (Professional cleaning of teeth) is a ...

Painless Procedure,

Done with the help of an Ultrasonic Cleaning Device.

The procedure removes the Calculus deposits (CALCIFIED PLAQUE AND TARTAR DEPOSITS) & stains That cannot be removed by brushing.

If the Dental calculus accumulating on teeth is not removed by scaling (ultrasonic teeth cleaning), It can lead to...

GUM DISEASE

Progression of GUM DISEASE I

Early stages of gum disease

- -Painless
- -Gums are red and swollen
- -Bleeding while brushing
- -Bad breath arises.

Second stage

- -The gum margins become detached from the tooth surface and a pocket (periodontal pocket) forms between the tooth and gums.
- -Exposure of the tooth root.
- -Sensitivity and pain occurs.

Third stage

-BONE DESTRUCTION occurs at this stage. 🗕

-The TOOTH IS LOOSE!



TREATMENT at each stages

- -Brushing and flossing
- -Calculus removal by ultrasonic teeth cleaning (scaling)
- -Proper medications



- -Brushing and flossing
- -Sub gingival Calculus removal by ultrasonic teeth cleaning (scaling)
- -Proper medications
- -Gum surgery (Periodontal flap surgery)









Diagram showing crown and bridge Fixed Denture placement on missing tooth area.





PARTS OF A DENTAL IMPLANT



Mal occlusion(improper teeth alignment) may lead to the following problems...

Poor facial appearance

Malocclusion adversely affects the facial appearance of an individual.

Risk of caries

Mal-alligned teeth makes oral hygeine maintenance difficult. thereby increasing the risk of dental caries occurrence.

Periodontal diseases

Mal occlusion causes poor oral hygiene which initiates periodontal disease.

Psycological disturbances

As mal occlusion adversely affects the appearance of the individual, it may cause psycological disturbances.

Risk of trauma

Proclined teeth are always prone to risk of fracture, during play or accidents.

Abnormalities of function

Mal occlused teeth causes functional disturbances likeimproper chewing, speech defects, breathing problems etc. 7

Tempero-mandibular joint problems

Mal occlused teeth causes Temperomandibular joint pain and dysfunction.



Invis align is a method of orthodontic treatment which uses a series of CLEAR, REMOVABLE TEETH ALIGNERS

Disadvantages

The success of the Invis aligners is based on the patient's commitment to wear the aligners (for a minimum of 20-22 hours per day).

If the patients fail to keep the aligners in for the required length of time, then the next aligner in the series will not fit, and a new set of impressions and aligners will be necessary, adding to the cost.

As the aligners are removed for eating, there are chances of losing them.

The system is more expensive than traditional wire and bracket systems.


